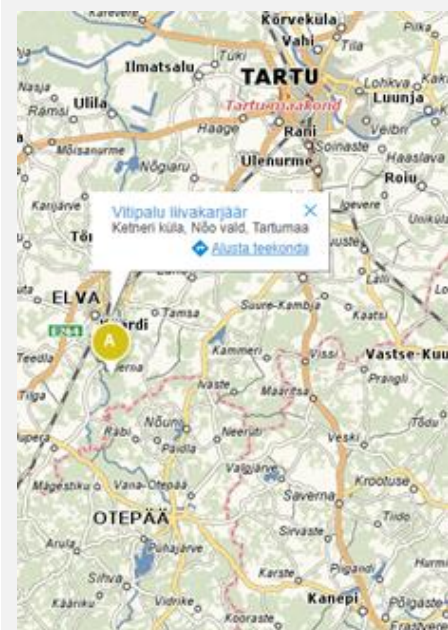

On both days, shortened long distance with individual start (except of MW21E, see Euromeeting bulletin).

CP running order and CP number are printed next to the control circle (1-31). Control description is printed on the map; there are additional control descriptions, tape, and scissors available close to the pre-start.

Electronic punching system

SPORTident punching system will be used at all competitions. SI-rent is 2 € per day. In case a SI card is lost or damaged, the competitors are obliged to cover the expenses (50 €). Change of SI-card number at the competition centre costs 1 €.

Number bibs

Each competitor has a number bib, which should be attached on the chest. Number bibs are available at the competition centre.

Please bring your own safety pins!

Warm-up

Warm up area is on the road (see competition scheme). On Saturday, there will be a model/warm-up map. Each athlete can find the warm-up map next to the info wall.

Starts

Start 1 is located at the competition centre (see competition scheme). All classes except of MW8-10 and open race start from Start 1.

Start intervall 2 min, pre-start 3 min. Competitors who are late to the start will be guided to a separate start corridor.

Map start point is 250 m from pre-start (Start 1).

Start 2 is located 200m from the competition centre. There will be signs guiding to the start. Start 2 is open from **13:00-16:00** on Saturday and **10:30-12:30** on Sunday – each competitor can choose their own start time. There will be organizers helping MW8-10 athletes.

Map start point is located at the start (Start 2).

Finish

Route from the last control to the finish will be marked on the terrain, but **not on the map** (course on the map will end with the last control due to lack of space). Athletes have to punch on the **finish** line.

Refreshment controls

On Saturday, longer courses (M21A, M21B, M16A, M18, M20, M35, M40, M45, M50, M55, M60, N18, N20, N21A, N35, N40) will have a refreshment point. Refreshment point is located on the terrain, not in a control. Water will be served.

Prize giving ceremony

Winners will be awarded with prizes from Suunto. Competition times of both days will be summarized and top three in each class will be awarded. In MW8-10, all competitors will get a small prize.

Prize giving ceremony takes place on Sunday at 14:00.

Complaints and protests

Any complaint shall be made in written form and handed over to organizers at the information tent or to the competition director as soon as possible. A special form is available at the information tent. Complaints regarding the results shall be made no later than 15 minutes after the full preliminary results have been published at the competition centre.

A written protest can be made against the organizer's decision about a complaint. Written protests shall be delivered personally to a jury member no later than 15 minutes after the organizers have announced the decision about the complaint.

Euromeeting

In parallel to Suunto Games, Euromeeting (WRE) will take place in MW21E classes. There will be a big screen at the competition centre where it's possible to follow GPS tracking of Euromeeting participants:

- middle distance (WRE) on Saturday from 14:45;
- pursuit on Sunday from 12:30.
